OUR PROGRAMS

Chalk the Town

We partner with the Creston Chamber to decorate our town for the thousands of visitors who come for the 4th of July. Our "Walk of Chalk" is a way for great Creston businesses that are not on the Parade Route to be represented. We give out over 300 packs of chalk to kids! This is our chance for the youth to participate in Community Engagement. Thank you businesses!

Summer Art Camp

Three weeks of kids and art projects. Most projects are successful, and all of them are fun. We have young kids in the morning and older kids in the afternoon. Held in the High School Art Room in the last three weeks of June, it is the perfect start to your children's summer. We focus on turning found household materials into art. Send your teens to volunteer and work on leadership skills! Art Camp is a place where we celebrate diversity among our students, assistants and instructors. All are welcome and all are encouraged to express themselves and their culture through art.





Art Camp continued...

Our Summer Art Camp scholarship program was a huge success thanks to lowa State Savings Bank, who was our 2019 Sponsor. We were extremely proud to meet our goal of 25% scholarships, which meant that 12 kids were able to attend three weeks of Art Camp. These kids would most likely not have gone to any summer camp. The Depot Gallery

The Gallery is a place to showcase local talent, as well as bring visiting arts, to inspire us, entertain us, and enrich our lives with its presence. The Depot Gallery is free and is open 6 days a week or by appointment. We host an Artist's Reception at the gallery on the First Friday of each month 6-8 in the evening. We are working with The Young Professionals Group and other Uptown retailers to stay open late and have special events on First Fridays of 2020.

Public Art & Murals

Creston Arts partnered with the CCHS and UCDA to paint a quilt on the intersection of Adams and Maple in 2019. This year we are looking to expand that project with additional painted street murals and extensive mural projects in Uptown Alleyways.

OUR HISTORY

The Creston: Arts Council, a 501(c)3 non-profit, has been serving this community since 1977. In 2011 a new group of volunteers took over and began art programming. 2020 will be our seventh year of Summer Art Camp, our eighth year of Chalk the Town, and our ninth year providing shows in the Depot Gallery.

OUR IMPACT

As an organization, Creston Arts has worked to improve the physical appearance of the Creston community and the understanding of art. Over the past several years, Creston Arts has supported improvements totaling nearly \$50,000 for in-kind and fiscal sponsorship support for various art projects in the Creston community. In addition, scholarships have allowed those in need to attend art camp, gallery space has allowed for hundreds of individuals to view various forms of art and Chalk the Town has given individuals of all ages an opportunity to decorate Uptown Creston for the 4th of July.

OUR NEED

Shortly before the sale of lowa State Savings Bank to Ames National Corporation in late 2019, lowa State Savings Bank gifted the building located at 411 W. Adams St. in Uptown Creston to Creston Arts to be renovated as a community art center. Along with the gift of the facility, came seed funding of \$50,000 to begin the renovation process.


